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ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

#### **Growth Conditions**

Medium:

ATCC Medium 1869: PRAS-PYG with Tween 80

ATCC Medium 260: Trypticase soy agar/broth with defibrinated sheep blood

**Temperature:** 37°C **Atmosphere:** Anaerobic

## Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
- 2. Under anaerobic conditions, withdraw 0.5 ml of the appropriate medium from a single test tube (5 to 6 ml) and rehydrate the entire vial contents.
- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Additional tubes and

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an anaerobic #260 agar plate may be inoculated with 0.5 ml each from the suspension. Streak onto an additional blood plate and incubate aerobically to check for purity.

4. Incubate tubes and one #260 plate under an anaerobic atmosphere at 37°C.

#### ANAEROBIC CONDITIONS:

- Tubes of media are placed under a gassing cannula system connected to a source of oxygen-free gas.
- All transfers are performed while the test tubes are on the cannula system with a gentle stream of oxygen free gas flowing through the system.
- As the test tubes are removed from the cannula system each is sealed with butyl rubber stopper thus maintaining the anaerobic headspace.

#### Notes

Always use freshly prepared pre-reduced media or pre-reduced media that has been previously prepared but stored under anaerobic conditions. Resazurin in the media is a color indicator for anaerobic conditions. Observance of pink color in medium before use or during incubation shows anaerobic conditions have not been met and oxidation has occurred. Medium should be discarded.
